Discernment Process

Get Ready:

- 1. Clarify the question for discernment
- 2. Gather the community for discernment
- 3. Assign a facilitator or 'discernmentarian'
- 4. Affirm guiding values or principles

Get Set:

- 1. Take space to become aware of the presence of God
- 2. Prayer for indifference and prayer of indifference
- 3. Test for indifference
- 4. Prayer for Wisdom
- 5. Prayer of Quiet Trust

Go!

- 1. Set the Agenda
- 2. Listen Together to the question for discernment
- 3. Gather information and notice without judging
- 4. Listen in Silence
- 5. Reconvene and listen again
- 6. Weigh the options
- 7. Agree together
- 8. Seek inner confirmation and peace
- 9. Act in response to discernment seek God along the way

Criteria For Discernment

Gather and Assess Information - ask good questions

- 1. How does this choice fit with the overall direction and calling of God on our community/project?
- 2. Which choice brings the deepest sense of life, inner peace and freedom? Growing sense of wholeness, authenticity and congruence with who we are in God
- 3. **Desire** what are our deepest and most authentic desires relative to the choice we are facing?
- 4. **Scripture** is there a particular Scripture that God is bringing to mind relative to this choice?
- 5. **Prophetic** how has God been speaking prophetically? Through dreams, words of knowledge and wisdom?
- 6. **Life of Christ** is this choice consistent with what we know about the mind and heart of Christ and his loving, redemptive purposes in the world?
- 7. **Character growth and development** What is God doing in our character and spiritual growth as a community? How will this direction nurture the fruit of the Spirit in us, particularly love?
- 8. **Love** what does love call for in this situation?
- 9. **Clarify perspective** Step back what is the larger pattern of what God is doing in our community. Step forward on our deathbeds which choice would we wish we had made?
- 10. **Community** How does this choice fit with other's observations of who I we are and what God is doing in our life as a community?

Ø Biblical Prayers For Wisdom

If any of you lacks wisdom, you should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault, and it will be given to you.

What Next?

Take time in your next leadership meeting to identify one or two elements of the process you can realistically incorporate into your leadership process. Then, try introducing one or two aspects of discernment into the process of making the decisions you are facing.

Could you introduce a little bit of silence for listening to God after the information about a decision has been fully shared?

Do you feel safe enough with each other to introduce the test for indifference before you enter into the heart of the discernment process?

Is there someone on your team you could trust with facilitating the discernment process, or do you need to invite someone from outside the group to hold the process in place?

Could you make it a practice to consider what additional voices need to be invited to speak into a particular question or issue you are discerning?¹
